LukePrep...Urban Institute for Continuing Education

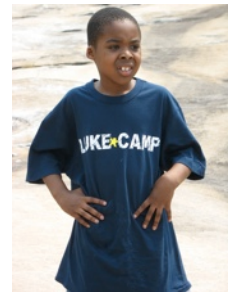
LukePrep is a college preparatory program, our “Urban Institute for Continuing Education”. The goal of LukePrep is to provide students with Biblical literacy skills, as well as critical life and educational skills, in an exciting and relevant format. The curriculum includes topics such as reading, writing, math, science, and civics, as well as electives such as tennis, rock climbing, swim lessons, job exploration, health, fitness, budgeting and community service days.

LukeCamp...Comprehensive Ten week Summer Day Camp

The goal is for every camper to discover God’s plan for their life and develop increased self esteem and character.
